Introducing Sandgate Park



Early this year, Sandgate Parish Council ran a poll on the local choice for name for the park on Military Road, generally known as Military Road Recreation Ground.

Many names were put forward, but in an online vote "Sandgate Park" was preferred by the majority of voters and that's now its new name!

Sandgate Parish Council took control of the management and maintenance of the park from Shepway Council in 2012.

Since then over £150,000 has been spent on the park. This has been invested in refurbishing the tennis

court, multi-use games area, boules pitch, adding picnic benches, new play equipment and more.

Funding has come from the Parish Council itself, District Councillor grants and a generous contribution from the De Haan Charitable Trust.

Plans are in place to add a small car park, reshape and re-fence the dog run and reinstate the toilet block.

The Council are also seeking funding to improve the artificial surface of the five a side football pitch, making it more usable all year round.

In 2016 Sandgate Library became the 1st in Kent to be run by a Parish Council on behalf of Kent Council.

By taking direct control of the management of the library, we have been able to extend opening hours, introduce new events and are now extending the book range under the beady eye of Parish Clerk Gaye Thomas - a chartered librarian in her own right!

Recent figures show quarterly borrowing up 18% and group membership up 20% after the first year of Sandgate's management.

SPC Annual Return

Sandgate Parish Council have a total budget of around £80,000 a year.

This is spent in a variety of ways, from maintaining and improving Sandgate Park to running the library, funding street Christmas decorations, hanging baskets, events and grants.

Sandgate Parish Council has bought and sited a defibrillator on "The Boat House" on Granville Parade sea front.

A defibrillator is a device that gives an electric shock to the heart to someone who is in cardiac arrest.

The equipment is there to save lives. It should only be used in emergencies.

The cabinet is unlocked with a code that will be given during a 999 call.

The defibrillator has easy to follow instructions provided in operation.

Many people noticed this year that displays were mounted removed from streetlights Sandgate High Street. Kent Highways had licenced the baskets, but then tested the columns and revoked the licence, requiring the baskets to be removed. With grateful thanks to Harmer and Sons who undertook the work, they were then re-sited to other direction posts and the large display on the Esplanade that has been so well received.

Christmas light garlands on High Street street lights, the Village Green tree, Golden Valley tree and other decorations, will all be in place for the "turning on" ceremony on 25th November.

Sandgate Library

Uniquely in Kent, Sandgate Library is run by Sandgate Parish Council on behalf of Kent County Council, providing a locally managed service with extended opening hours and facilities.

The Library is free to join - please just turn up with a proof of address. It's then free to borrow books, with CDs, DVDs for a small charge. We offer free wifi and a free tea / coffee for visitors.

There is also FREE Public Computer Use and a Computer Buddy to help you get started using IT.
